It was a fitting return to Canberra for Olly who was an outstanding guest speaker and more important the wonderful legacy he has left in Australian racing.

The final part of the luncheon was the auctioning of a 5% share in a filly to be trained by the Joseph Jones Racing that raised valuable funds for future Carbine Club Scholarship.

The Carbine Club of Western Australia held its AGM on Friday February 21st, 2025, on the banks of the Swan River at the highly regarded Matilda Bay Restaurant in Nedlands.

The highlight of the meeting was the award of life membership to Reg Webb after 27 years of membership with the Club. The Carbine Club of WA Patron Lloyd Meredith presented Reg with his life membership award and had the following to say at the meeting.

"Reg Webb joined the Carbine Club of WA in 1997 and in 2003 was elected to the position of Treasurer – the 3rd such person to hold this highly esteemed office. In 37 years the club has only had 5 treasurers.

Reg has made an enormous contribution to our club – far greater than the 9 years he spent as Treasurer. He did it all in the "Reg Webb" style that any member who has had a drink or two with Reg will understand .

In his days as Treasurer, Reg made it his business to know every single member of the club – something achieved by very few of our members over the years. Reg showed it is not only possible to do this but it is really quite easy. The job of treasurer back then was vastly different to what is required today. Nobody had heard of an eft in 2003 – you paid either by cash or cheque. and Reg was right onto any member who failed to pay for his lunch table on or before the day.

For Reg's first 2 years as Treasurer I happened to be the Secretary. It was our joint responsibility to arrange table locations for the club lunches. One thing that has not changed since those days is the whinging from members when they draw the back pocket or the wing in the dining room! Reg introduced a novel way of fixing this problem. He and I made sure his and my tables were always in the back row – that quickly silenced members complaining about their table location.

In those days everyone paid in cash or by cheque. It was common that Reg was left with thousands of dollars in his possession at the end of the day – and the bank didn't open until Monday. Reg particularly enjoyed the fellowship at the bar after each and every lunch. On one particular day at the Sheraton in Perth, Reg got an earlier start than usual and decided that he could not be responsible for the club's takings. As I was about to leave he asked me to look after the bag. We still drove home from lunches back then so it was no problem for me until, on Sunday morning my wife Jan and I were taking off for lunch. We piled into my car and Jan said "what's this bag doing here?" Yep, the loot from Friday's lunch safely stored in the carpark of our apartment block!

Reg epitomises the true Carbine Club member. If there is a club event on and he is available, he will be there.

In 2007 we held the first of many lunches in Broome to assist the Broome Racing Club with their Cup celebrations. Great times! I believe that Reg did not miss a single Broome Cup Luncheon. Then there was Rottneest. For many
