A full house (sold out since January) saw Kirkland Tellwright (the recently retired Clerk of the Course at Haydock Park)-pic left below- regale the audience with a series of thoughts and anecdotes, which daily face the boss of a major racecourse.

This was followed by a round-up of celebrities being interviewed by the magician racing commentator and member Nick Luck (including Michael Buckley owner of Constitution Hill, odds on favourite of the Champion Hurdle, Richard Thompson of the Cheveley Park Stud and our own member Ed Ware amongst several other of our notable guests). Nick was joined then by member trainers George Baker and Richard Phillips.

Member Jim McGrath was absent as he was visiting Australia but still managed to send in his tips together with one of his best and longest phantom calls of the Cheltenham Gold Cup. The audience was spellbound for 6 minutes and 9 seconds as Jim meticulously called each horse through the whole three miles, two and a half furlongs of one of the nation's most prestige National Hunt races.



On the racing front CC Club horse Carbine Harvester managed a very creditable second recently and then followed with a win at Kempton Park carrying 9st9lbs and leading all the way. This sees him qualify for the valuable (£85,000)3YO All Weather Championships at Newcastle on Good Friday. And, no doubt, the Club is cheering on the fortunes of Club member William Haggas as he pursues yet another raid on the Australian racing scene.

The Carbine Club of Tasmania advises that, regretfully, the International Congress scheduled for 2026 has been cancelled due to insufficient starters.

Racing website idolhorse.com recently reported on the fabulous run Haggas has had since he started bringing horses to race in Australia, saying:

When Dubai Honour steps out in Saturday's G1 Queen Elizabeth Stakes (2000m), he will be seeking to continue not only his own stellar form in Australia, but he will also attempt to enhance the remarkable Sydney statistics of his trainer William Haggas.

Haggas has saddled up 23 starters in Sydney for 11 wins, including six Group 1 victories and Australia's second-richest race, the A\$10 million Golden Eagle. Those 23 starters, between them, banked \$14,366,550 – or the equivalent of about £6.8 million – at an average of \$624,633 per start.

The wins continue, with Dubai Honour adding another Group 1 race win, the Tancred Stakes run on 1 April, to the scoreboard, making him unbeaten in 3 Group 1 starts in Sydney.

The race is named after the highest peak in the Stirling Range in the Great Southern region of Western Australia and run over the same distance as the height of this peak, being 1099 metres.
